Social Justice



Last week our Social Justice focus addressed the importance of actively supporting Human Dignity. The focus aims to foster an understanding that we are all made in God's image and that every person is special. We teach the children that we treat each other with respect and kindness and ensure that the dignity of every person is upheld in all situations. House Points will be given to students who exhibit behaviour and communication that demonstrates respect for others and upholds their dignity. The efforts and points accumulated were shared at our assembly yesterday.



This week our focus for Social Justice is "Common Good". The aim this week is to teach the children that it is important to do what is best for everyone, not just yourself in many situations.

"The learning experiences (at St Joseph's) should seek to integrate faith, culture and life and be designed to demonstrate the value held for the dignity of each person, a preferred culture of community and educating for citizenship that reflects a commitment to social justice" (CES Ltd). The students will see the tally of points at Assembly each week and work together to increase their understanding of the importance of Human Dignity throughout the term.

As stated in the last newsletter, staff are encouraged to acknowledge and reward students who demonstrate our school's Learning Attitudes and commitment to social justice, reinforcing our values in these areas. Points will be recorded on the whiteboard and collected by the student messenger. At the end of each term, the house with the most points will be rewarded, possibly with an extended lunch break.

St Joseph's School Review



Annual Action Plan

Aligned with the Catholic Education Sandhurst Strategic Plan 2023-2027, St Joseph's Annual Action Plan for 2024 sets clear goals in line with the Diocesan strategy. Our Annual Action Plan which drives our planning and strategic design is available on our School Website. A summary of the work that we are implementing at the moment includes the following:

Our current School Improvement Goal states that our students will become assessment-capable learners who can reflect on their learning journey to evaluate their learning against success criteria. Using the success criteria students can comment how they are progressing in their learning and understand what they need to do to improve. In order to support this strategy for learning, teachers will display anchor charts with worked examples for students to compare against so that children know what they need to know, and their next steps for learning success. Learning intentions and success criteria are always visible. Students will effectively evaluate their learning progress and teachers use various data sources to inform teaching.

Last term we commenced our Sacramental preparations with a wonderful session led by Maria Ford. Throughout the evening, the children and families who will participate in the Sacramental Program throughout 2024 learned about all the Sacraments of the Catholic Church.

Helen Goh's carmelised Anzac bars

Ingredients

FOR THE OATS BASE LAYER

100g plain flour

30g light brown sugar

30g granulated sugar

80g rolled oats

1/4 tsp salt

100g unsalted butter, chilled, cut into 5 pieces

FOR THE COCONUT CARAMEL TOPPING

100g unsalted butter

60g light brown sugar

120g golden syrup (or runny honey)

60ml pure cream

1 tsp vanilla extract

1/8 tsp salt

120g dried coconut threads

sprig of rosemary, for garnish

Method



2. Place the flour, sugars, oats and salt in a food processor fitted with the blade attachment and pulse a few times to combine. Add the butter and continue to pulse until the mixture forms a rough crumble (about 20 pulses), then tip the mixture out into a bowl. Rub the crumbs together to make sure there are no large pieces or any unmixed lumps of butter, then scatter the crumbs evenly over the base of the prepared tin. Press the mixture down firmly using the back of a spoon so that you have an even, compact layer.

3. Place into the preheated oven and bake for 25 minutes until set and light brown. Remove from the oven (but leave it switched on) and allow the oat base to cool for 15 minutes.

4. While the base is baking, prepare the topping. Combine the butter, brown sugar and golden syrup in a medium saucepan, placed over low heat. Cook, stirring the mixture until the butter has melted, then increase the heat to medium and bring gently to a simmer. Simmer without stirring for 5 minutes, then add the cream, vanilla, salt and coconut. Stir well for a minute or two to combine, then pour the mixture over the oat base. Use a small spatula to even the top, then place into the oven.

5. Bake for about 25 minutes, until the top is golden brown and bubbling. Remove from the oven and place the tin on a wire rack to cool for about an hour, before easing around the edges of the tin with a butter knife to release the bar. Remove from the tin and place onto a wire rack to cool completely.

6. Once cooled, slice the bar into squares or rectangles. Pile the pieces onto plates, place a sprig of fresh rosemary on top, then serve.


Year Six Students Visit TAFE





EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

completes the plan.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
