Dear Parents and Carers

Pentecost Sunday



Last Sunday, we celebrated *Pentecost*, one of the most important feasts in the Christian calendar. Pentecost marks the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, empowering them to go forth and spread the Good News. It is often considered the "birthday of the Church," symbolising unity, courage, and mission. Students participated in classroom reflections and liturgies, exploring the gifts of the Holy Spirit and their relevance in our daily lives.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Students preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation have been deepening their understanding of forgiveness and the loving mercy of God. This important Sacrament allows children to reflect on their choices and reconnect spiritually through confession, prayer, and absolution. We thank the parents, staff and the Sacramental team of St Joseph's Parish who have continued to support the children's faith journey through conversations at home, prayer and preparation for receiving the Sacrament last Thursday. Congratulations to all the children, knowing that we will keep them all in our prayers so that they enjoy the peace that reconciliation will bring into their lives.

PAT Reading and Numeracy Testing

This fortnight, our students will be participating in the ACER PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) in Reading and Numeracy. These assessments are *not timed* and aim to provide valuable insights into each child's learning progress and skills. Teachers and LSOs supervise during the test by helping students understand how to navigate the test confidently. A practice session is completed beforehand to ensure students feel comfortable. The data collected will be used to inform report writing and help guide future teaching strategies tailored to student needs.

StepLab Implementation

St Joseph's is beginning implementation of **StepLab**, a teacher development platform designed to support evidence-based teaching practices. This work will guide instructional improvement across classrooms, ensuring a consistent and high-quality learning experience for all students.

MultiLit Literacy Program

Our Years 3–6 students are benefiting from **MultiLit**, a structured literacy program focusing on phonics, fluency, and comprehension. Online meetings and teacher support have been instrumental in embedding this program into our daily routines to support literacy growth.







Classroom Mastery

The St Joseph's Staff will attend professional development in "Classroom Mastery" next Tuesday, 17th June 2025 at the Wangaratta Performing Arts and Convention Centre.

St Joseph's will participate in this professional development with the following schools: Our Lady's School Wangaratta South, St Mary's School Rutherglen and St Monica's School Wodonga.

Throughout Sandhurst, we are committed to fostering a learning environment where every student feels safe, supported and inspired to grow. One of the ways we do this is through our involvement in the Knowledge Society, *Classroom Mastery* program, a professional learning initiative supported and by Catholic Education Sandhurst (CES Ltd).

Classroom Mastery equips our teachers and school leaders with evidence-informed strategies to create consistent, calm and purposeful classrooms. It focuses on building a positive school culture where high expectations, respectful relationships and clear routines underpin learning and daily practice. Staff participate in ongoing training and coaching to enhance their capacity to explicitly teach and reinforce pro-social behaviours, manage disruptions positively, and build strong connections with students.

Through this shared approach, we aim to ensure that every classroom at St Joseph's is a place where students are ready to learn, feel valued, and are supported to thrive—socially, emotionally and academically.

We invite our community to learn how Classroom Mastery was developed and why it's resonating across Australia. What are classroom routines and what makes these routines so effective? Catholic schools in the Sandhurst Diocese are adapting the model to their own context through Magnify Sandhurst program. The research behind behaviour and how low-level disruptions impact achievement is important and provides us with an exciting opportunity to continue to improve our school.

To help keep all children and families safe, Benalla Police have contacted the school to advise that they will now be patrolling the area regularly.


Please be aware that infringements may be issued to drivers who are found parking illegally or not following the road rules.




Twenty-two students finished in the top 20 and twelve finished in the top 50. Each race/age group had over a hundred students competing.

EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

 Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Training Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an Infringement Notice.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

Attending the Early Years = Greater chance of success
